NIGHT FEVER

LOW KEY Lounge 24 (3 Rävåla. Tel. 682 3422) Teetering on the 24th floor, this bar attracts a sophisticated crowd keen to enjoy the great drinks and fabulous views of the city.

LIVE MUSIC Kolumbus Kristostomus (24 Viru, Old Town. Tel. 5615 6924) The best local bands perform rock tunes, with occasional folksy and jazzy additions, in this fun-loving and positively crazy bar.

LATE & LIVELY BonBon (6E Mere Puiestee. Tel. 661 6080) One of the classiest, but certainly not the largest, options in town. Usually filled to the brim with a chic and beautiful twentysomething crowd.

ON THE GROUND

SHOP - Try Nu Nordik for the quirkiness of young Estonian designers. Even if you don't buy, a few moments of amusement are guaranteed (8 Vabaduse Väljak, Old Town).

INSIDER TIP - On *Jaaniõhtu* (Midsummer's Eve), Estonians all around the country gather with their families and communities and celebrate with bonfires, singing and dancing, as they've done for centuries.

KEY AREA - Want an overview of the city? Head to Toompea (Upper Town). For the best views go to the sightseeing platforms at Rahukohtu, Kohtu and Toom-Kooli streets.

THIS MONTH - The 27th Old Town Days festival is a journey back to medieval Tallinn, with street markets, entertainers and concerts. This month the Old Town turns into a huge theme park (2-8 June. www.vanalinnaevad.ee).

DAY TRIPPING

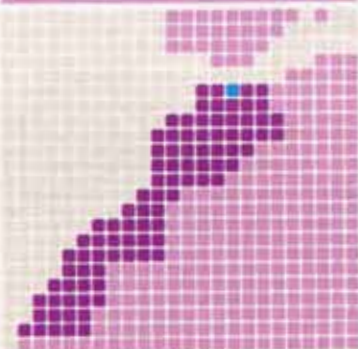
Pärnu - Considered the summer capital of Estonia. Just an hour and a half away is all the sunshine, sand, warm seawater and beautiful views you could ever want. A relatively quiet place most of the year, Pärnu comes alive in the warmer months, with festivals, parties and nightclubs.

NO WAY!

The Estonian language contains lots of words on loan from German, Swedish, Russian, French, Finnish and even English—so it's likely you can utter a couple of words that will be understood by Estonians without even knowing it!

FROM THE AIRPORT

Car Hire: Take advantage of the special easyJet inflight rate. Visit the Europcar desk on arrival or call +212 (0)39 941 938. Open from 7am-10pm seven days a week.

Airport Transfer: Pre-book your door-to-door transfer with easyJet's transfer partner, Holiday Taxis—from home to the airport and the airport to city or resort. Just log on to easyjet.holidaytaxi.com.

Taxi: Take one of the cream-coloured taxis to the city for about MAD100.

BON APPETIT

UP TO €15 El Meson Pèpé
Ocaña (7 Rue Jabha al Wataniya) This small bar might win the prize for best tapas for the price of a beer in Tangier—though women beware, you may be among an entirely male crowd.

UP TO €30 Yachting Club (Port of Tangier. Tel. 061 114 444) With front-row seats of the fishing boats docking with their catch of the day, enjoy simply prepared seafood like grilled swordfish, without any doubt about its freshness.

UP TO €50 La Pagode (3 Rue El Boussiri. Tel. 039 944 902) Going Chinese may not seem logical in Morocco, but this red-themed old Tangier favourite accomplishes a unique Moroccan-Chinese fusion. Especially successful are the spring rolls and chicken with almond appetiser. The glazed duck is mouth-watering.

EXCLUSIVE Dar Nour (20 Rue Gourna, Kasbah. Tel. 062 112 724) This bohemian, boutique-style bed and breakfast—featured in international travel and fashion magazines—offers original gourmet Moroccan recipes. After dinner, enjoy tea on one of the three terraces. Must reserve a table by noon of the day you wish to dine.

NIGHT FEVER

LOW KEY Dean's Bar (Corner Rue d'Angleterre & Rue de la Liberté) A legendary meeting place founded in 1937, this neon-lit tapas bar attracts those keen to catch football on TV.

LIVE MUSIC London's Pub (15 Rue Jabha al Wataniya) This slick and usually packed bar serving tapas presents a live singer and keyboardist doing oriental pop tunes every night on a balcony above the crowd.

LATE & LIVELY Le Snob (Boulevard Mohamed VI. Tel. 060 091 286) Along the beach strip of clubs, this average house club stands out for its younger and more western Moroccan party-goers.

ON THE GROUND

SHOP - Volubilis boutique owner Mohamed Raiss El Funi works the highest quality leather from Chefchouen and handwoven fabrics into a funky, unique clothing line characterised by bright colours and comfortable light fabrics (Petit Socco. Tel. 039 333 875).

INSIDER TIP - The Chellah Beach Club, along the bay of Tangier, holds a salsa night every Thursday. If you're still learning, get there from 8pm-9pm to catch a free lesson (Avenue Mohamed VI. Tel. 039 325 068).

KEY AREA - Cap Spartel, about 15 kilometres west of the city centre, is where the Mediterranean and Atlantic meet. You can visit its yellow lighthouse, which was erected during the International Zone period.

THIS MONTH - The sixth annual Mediterranean Short Film Festival of Tangier offers serious competition for aspiring and established film-makers from Mediterranean countries, as well as a retrospective of Moroccan classic shorts (23-28 June. www.ccm.ma).

DAY TRIPPING

Cabo Negro - Located just 70 kilometres from Tangier, this beach resort town offers beautiful long beaches. One of the first Club Med resorts is here, plus good restaurants and hikes. Go by bus or white taxi from the main bus station.

NO WAY!

Many of Tangier's merchants are quadrilingual, even if they never finished school. That's what comes of being a port city for centuries!
